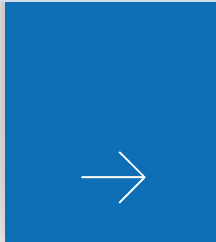

# Electronic data exchange with beneficiaries

MS shall

## **Electronic data exchange systems** (Art. 58(2)(k) NRPP):

- including use of automatic and interactive forms and calculations
- ensuring record-keeping and data storage in the system
- enabling administrative verifications of payment claims of beneficiaries and audits
- allowing for automatic synchronisation and transmission of data between beneficiaries' and Member States' systems

# Date collection and recording

MA / MS shall

**Electronic system recording and storing data** (Art. 51(1)(h), 58 & Annex IV NRPP):

- monitoring, progress reporting, evaluation
- financial management, verifications and audits,
- ensure data security, integrity, confidentiality and user authentication

**Monitoring and reporting system** (Art. 14(1) Performance Reg.):

- monitoring of performance, automated transmission of information

# Date collection and recording

MS shall

**Record and store electronically information on** (Art. 63(1) NRPP):

- **Beneficiary:** legal status, name, address, VAT/tax number, beneficial owners, Union contribution, associated measure,...
- **Recipient/final recipient, contractor, sub-contractor**
- **Operation:** name, identifier, location, description, objectives, call, dates, Union contribution, amount paid, third country participation, measure, milestone, target, indicators, and progress in achievements and for each indicator

# What information must be made available to the Commission?

MS shall

**Make available to the European Commission** (Art. 63(2) NRPP):  
the information referred to in paragraph 1 two times per year via automatic data-exchange arrangements

**Set up their systems for collection of data** (Art. 63(4) NRPP):

- in a digital-ready and interoperable way
- such that data is collected only once and re-used
- re-use existing registers and databases

# What information must be made public?

## Transparency

Information to be published **on own websites** (Art. 64(2) NRPP):

- The same data as in Article 63(1) NRPP, incl. information about beneficiaries, contractors, operations, amounts, intervention fields, milestones and targets.
- Ensure data are machine-readable, open, interoperable, and updatable at least every six months.

**The European Commission** shall (Art. 64(3) NRPP):

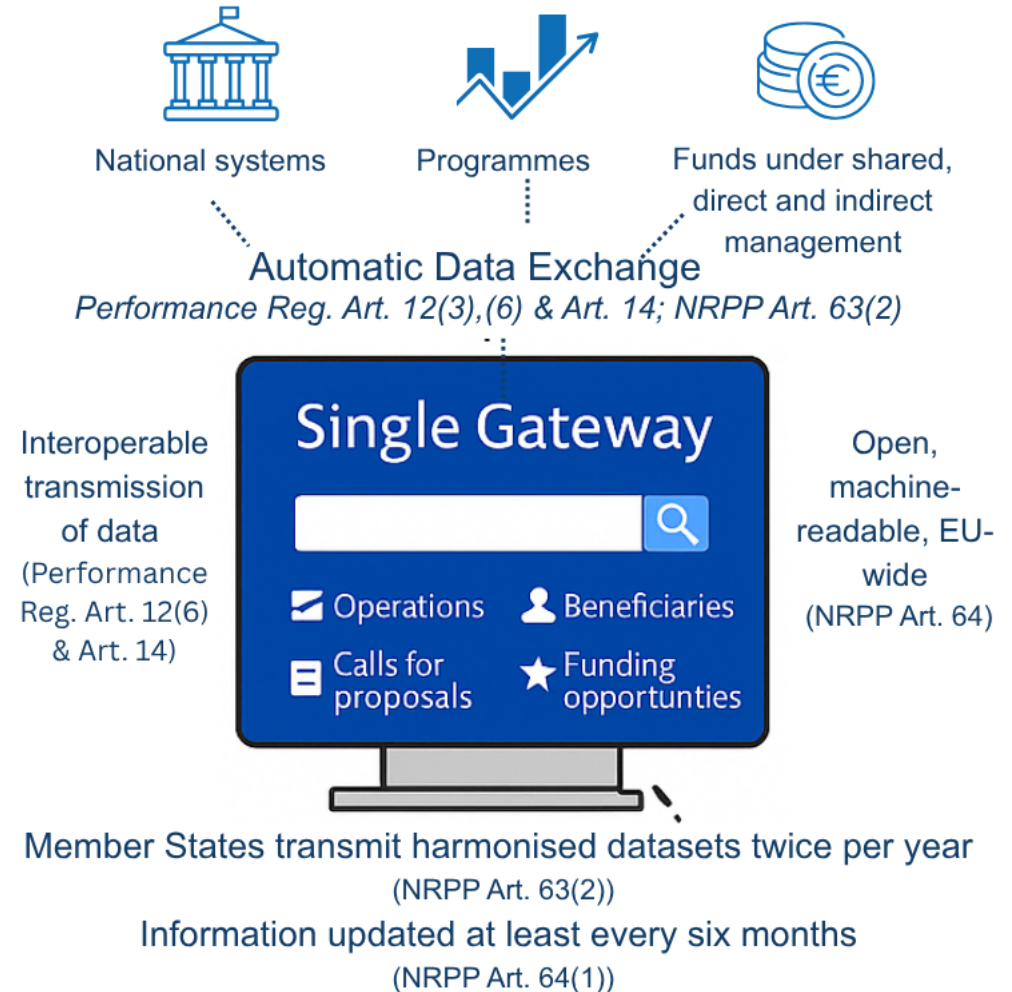
Publish the same information centrally on the Single Gateway, ensuring EU-wide visibility.

# Single Gateway

- A central EU online portal (Art. 12 Performance Reg.)
- Covers all shared, direct and indirect management funds.
- Enables to see **where to receive funding, who** receives it, for what purpose, and with what results.
- Ensures common data structures based on the list of intervention fields, output and result indicators (Art. 8 Performance Reg.)

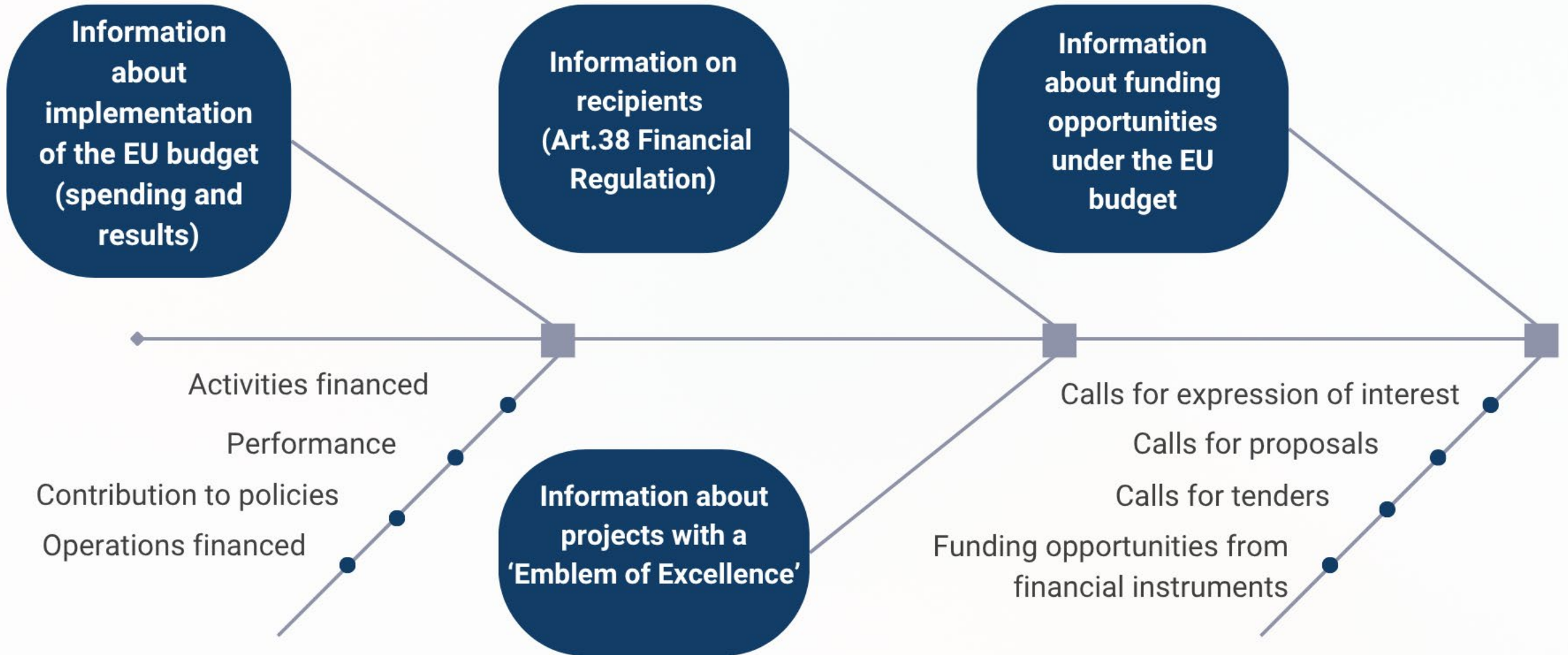

Performance Regulation Art. 12; NRPP Arts. 63–64

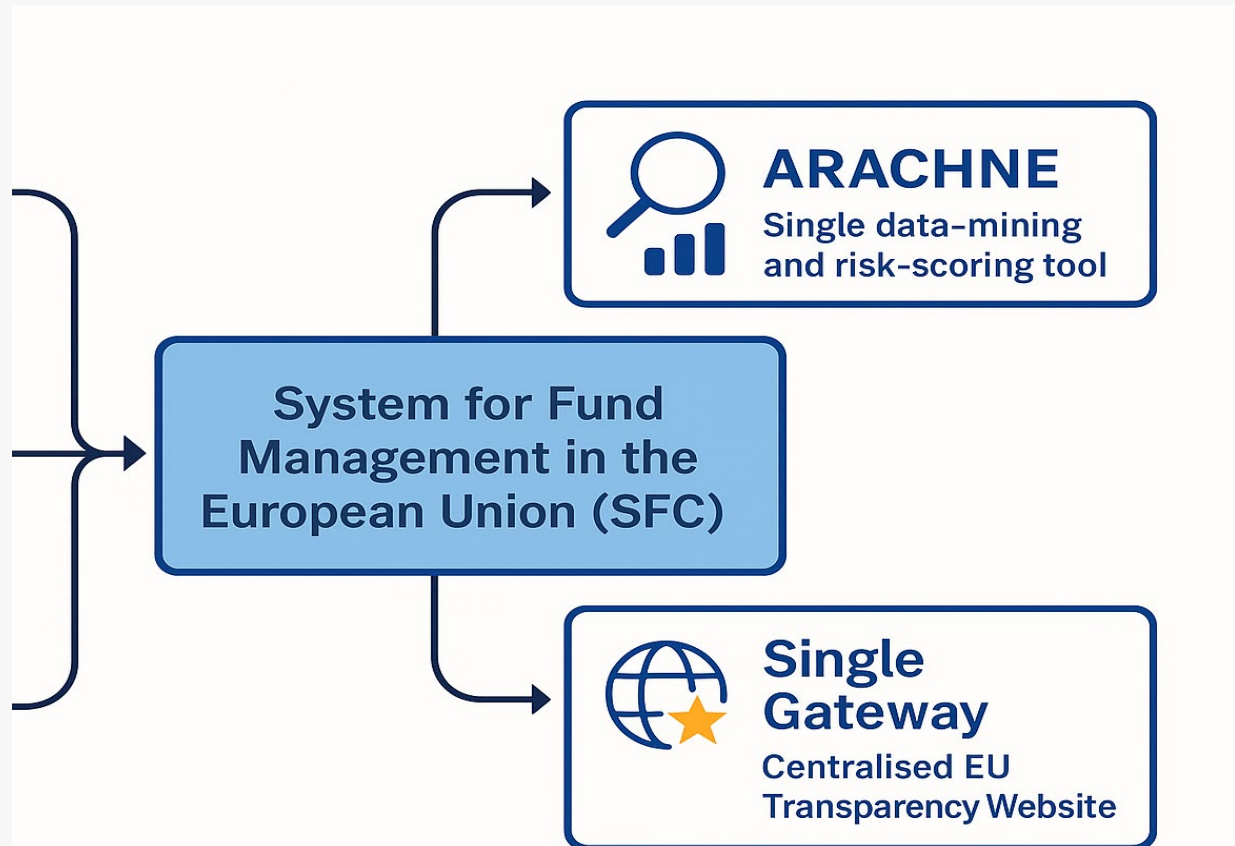

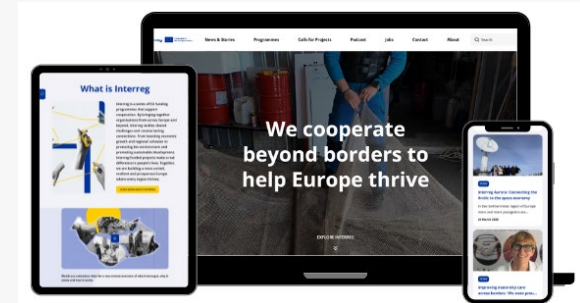
